Community Overview

The Village of Archbold is a town of around 5,000 people. The village's primary employer is Sauder Woodworking. This is a rural area with many farms and farmland. Over 22% of the households have an income of between \$50 and 75k, with a median income of \$53,000. Northwest Community College is located here as well. The church has various families from all of the surrounding villages and cities who attend here. Local attractions include parks, Goll Woods, Harrison Lake, and many other outdoor activities.

Why People Like Living Here

Archbold is a great place to live in Ohio. Living in Archbold gives residents a sparse suburban feel, and most residents own their homes. The community tends to lean conservative, and the public schools are highly rated. Low crime and low cost of living are two other obvious reasons to want to raise your family here. The median age in the city is about 38 years old. The city of Toledo is 50 miles away, and Detroit Airport is only 90 miles. Fort Wayne, Indiana, is also about 60 miles away, with a different airport and many amenities. Archbold provides that wonderful small-town sense of belonging with big cities only an hour's drive away.

Church History

"AEC" or "Evan," as we are often called, was founded in 1870 by Mennonite/Amish Germans and Swiss immigrants. In 1965 the church began a ministry outside of Lawton, MI which became to be known as Miracle Camp. The church continued to grow and had an attendance of 400-500 regularly. More recently, the attendance has been in the 300 range. The church was congregationally led until 2006, and from that point on has been Elder led. Church planting is a consistent theme of the church as well. In 1968 they planted a church in West Unity, Ohio, now known as Solid Rock Community Church. In 1984 a new church plant began in Perrysburg, Ohio, which is now called Oak Bend Community Church. In 1991 a church was planted in Angola, Indiana, now called Sonlight Community Church. In November of 2006 a parcel of 40 acres was purchased, and in 2008 the name of Archbold Evangelical Mennonite Church was changed to Archbold Evangelical Church. The new facility was built, and the congregation moved in on December 7, 2008. In the Atrium area of the church, there is a fascinating presentation of the church's inception to the development of church after church. Today, the church is very involved with "Synergy," a Fellowship of Evangelical Churches (FEC) directed ministry to build leaders and churches.

Overview of Weekly Worship Gathering

The worship service has a suburban feel in a rural community. The worship service is from 9-10:15am with four Adult Growth Groups that meet afterward. During the 9am worship service, children's classes from nursery through 6th grade are offered. The worship service is fairly typical, with an opening song, important announcements, 3 or 4 songs, and prayer. Each week there is a different focus on prayer or missions or ministry areas. On the first Sunday we share in the Lord's Supper with a standard passing of cups and bread shared together as the pastor and elders lead. People have an opportunity to greet one another, and the Biblical message is shared followed by prayer opportunities at the end of each service.

Tell Us About Your Facility

AEC has a facility that was built with the intention to provide a place for people to Gather for worship and to Grow together, with rooms provided for teaching and building relationships. The worship center provides comfortable seating for over 400 people. A modern sound system and excellent visual screens in the platform area keep everyone centered on the presentations, and the professional cameras provide a live visual production of the services to our community and homebound people through Youtube and Facebook. An excellent sound and media team provides a consistent worship presentation on a weekly basis. The children's reception area guides parents to rooms where their children are provided with an excellent teaching and fun time with their peers. This area is a visual draw with excellent murals and quality painting, leading us to various classrooms and then into a large Multi Media Gym style area. The Multi Media Gym area has seating as needed for up to 1000 people for various activities/programs/concerts throughout the year. The church is involved in encouraging friends and neighbors to join them as they Go and share the good news of Jesus and accept the gift of salvation He offers. AEC has a Youth Center called "the Garage." This center is complete with a worship seating area and sound and visual support for over 150 attendees. The two-story facility for youth allows teaching and fun for both small and large groups. The surrounding acreage of over five acres provides plenty of room for added needed facilities as we grow. An excellent outside garden and the recreational area provide multiple opportunities for outreach and community barbecues. All this and the facility and property is now debt free as a result of our 2022 Harvest Offering

Published Theological Statement

The beliefs expressed in this document (and stated in greater detail in the Fellowship of Evangelical Churches Manual of Faith, Practice, and Organization) form the theological basis for the existence of the Archbold Evangelical Church.



The Bible

• We believe that the Bible, consisting of the sixty-six books of the Old and New Testaments, is God's Word to all people. It was written by human authors under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. It is literally "God-breathed." Because the Bible is inspired by God, it is absolute truth without any mixture of error in the original writings, sufficient for all that God requires us to believe and do, and the supreme source of truth and authority for Christian beliefs and living. (2 Tim 1:13; 3:16; 2 Peter 1:20-21; Ps 12:6; 119:105,160; Prov 30:5)

Tri-une God

- We believe in the one true and living God who eternally exists in three equally divine Persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. He is the Creator and sovereign ruler of all things in the universe, visible and invisible. He is perfectly holy, righteous, and just, and He must punish sin because He cannot tolerate it. He is worthy to receive all glory and adoration. (Gen 1:1, 26-27; 3:22; Psalm 90:2; Matt 28:19; 1 Peter 1:2; 2 Cor 13:14)
 God the Father
- We believe in God as the Father who is good in all He does and in everything He gives, including His discipline. He perfectly loves and cares for His children, showing compassion to those who fear Him. He loved the world enough to send His Son, Jesus Christ, to be the Savior of the world. Through a personal relationship with Christ, we come to know God as our Father and can say, "Abba, Father." (John 3:16; Gal 3:26; 2 Cor 1:3; Ephes 4:6-7)

God the Son: Jesus Christ

- We believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God. He is co-equal with the Father, was conceived by the Holy Spirit, and born of the Virgin Mary, fully God and fully man. Jesus lived a sinless life and offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice, taking on Himself God's punishment for the sins of mankind by dying on a cross. He arose bodily from the dead on the third day, demonstrating His power over sin and death. He ascended into heaven and will return to earth in power and glory to reign as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. (Matt 1:22-23; Isa 9:6; John 1:1-5; 14:10-30; Heb 4:14-15; 1 Cor 15:3,4; Rom 1:3,4; Acts 1:9-11; 1 Tim 6:14-15; Tit 2:13) God the Holy Spirit
- We believe that the Holy Spirit is God and co-equal with the Father and the Son. He is present in the world to convict the world of sin and make humanity aware of their need for Jesus Christ. He also lives in every Christian from the moment of salvation. He provides the Christian with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth, and guidance in doing what is right. The Christian seeks to live under His control continually. (2 Cor 3:17; John 14:16-17; 16:7-13; Acts 1:8; 1 Cor 2:12; 3:16; Ephes 1:13; 5:18; Gal 5:25) 1

Man

We believe that, by an immediate act, God created man without sin in the image and likeness of God and as the supreme object of God's creation. By voluntarily disobeying God's command, man lost his original condition and became separated from God by his sin. As a result, all mankind are sinners by nature and by choice, guilty before God, deserving His righteous judgment, and unable to save themselves by selfimprovement or good works. (Gen 1:27; Ps 8:3-6; Isa 53:6; Rom 3:23; Is 59:1-2)



Salvation

• We believe that because God is rich in mercy and love, He has made a provision by which man can be saved from the punishment he deserves. Only by turning away from his sin and trusting in Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness can man be saved from sin's penalty, be born again by God's Spirit, and receive God's free gift of salvation. Eternal life begins the moment one receives Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior through faith in His atoning death and resurrection. (Eph 2:4,8-9; Rom 6:23; 5:1; Isa 55:7; Prov 28:13; Luke 13:3; John 1:12; 14:6; Tit 3:5; Gal 3:26)

Discipleship

• We believe that every Christian is called to follow Jesus Christ in faith and obedience, submitting to Him as Lord in every area of life. God commands the Christian to grow in Christ, and He provides the power to do so through the Holy Spirit who indwells every believer. He also provides His Word, prayer, the local body of believers, and trials to help bring about the Christian disciple's growth in faith, holiness, and Christ-likeness. (Matt 16:24-26; Luke 14:25-27, 33; 2Peter 3:18; 1 Peter 1:16; 2:2; Matt 26:41; Hebrews 10:24-25; James 1:2-4)

The Local Church

• We believe in the local church as a part of the universal Body of Christ. Its members are to be devoted to one another in love and to meet together regularly for worship, instruction, and mutual encouragement. The mission of the local church is to make disciples for Jesus Christ in its local community and throughout the world. The local church provides an avenue for the proper use of spiritual gifts and the observance of the ordinances of baptism and the Lord's Supper. (Matt 28:19-20;1 Cor 12-14; Ephes 4:11-16; Heb 10:24-25)

Believer's Baptism and the Lord's Supper

We believe that there are two ordinances which were instituted by the Lord Jesus Christ for perpetual use by the church. The first, water baptism, is the outward sign or symbol of what God has already done in the individual's life and is a testimony to all people that, through repentance and faith, the person now belongs to Jesus Christ. Baptism is administered in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The second ordinance, the Lord's Supper, is a commemoration of the death of Jesus and is done in remembrance of Him until He comes again; it is a sign of our loving participation in Him. Both ordinances are restricted to those who are believers in Christ. (Matt 28:19; Acts 8:35-39; 16:30-34; 1 Cor 11:17-34)

The Sanctity of Human Life

• We believe that all human life is sacred and created by God in his image. Human life is of inestimable worth in all its dimensions, including pre-born babies, the aged, the physically or mentally challenged, and every other stage or condition from conception through natural death. We are therefore called to defend, protect, and value all human life. (Ps 139)

Marriage and Divorce

• We believe that marriage was created and ordained by God and therefore can be rightfully defined only by Him. According to God's Word, marriage is an exclusive, permanent, and totally intimate relationship between one man and one woman. It is a covenant before God, intended to endure until the death of one of the partners. We believe



the Scriptures do not give liberty for a believer to marry a non-believer. We believe divorce is a basic violation of God's original intention for marriage. Although there are two cases in Scripture where divorce is permitted, it is nowhere encouraged in Scripture, and reconciliation should always be pursued with zeal. In the case of those who have divorced, we believe that Jesus Christ will show His mercy and forgiveness in response to their confession and repentance. Following Christ's example, His followers should also show forgiveness, restoration, love, and acceptance. (Gen 2:18-25; Romans 7:2; 1 Cor 7:10-13, 15; Eph 5:22-23; Matt 19:5-9)

- Gender and Sexuality
- We believe that God wonderfully and immutably creates each person as either male or female. These two distinct, complementary genders are of equal worth in the sight of God. Together they reflect the image and nature of God. Rejection of one's biological sex is a rejection of the image of God within that person. (Gen 1:26-27) We believe that God intends sexual intimacy to occur only between a man and a woman who are married to each other. We believe that God has commanded that no sexual activity be engaged in outside of a marriage between a man and a woman. We believe that any form of sexual immorality (including adultery, fornication, homosexual behavior, bisexual conduct, bestiality, incest, and use of pornography) is sinful and offensive to God. (1 Cor 6:9-20; 7:2-5; Heb 13:4; Matt 15:18-20)

Eternity

• We believe that man was created to exist forever. He will exist eternally, either separated from God by sin or in union with God through forgiveness and salvation. To be eternally separated from God is to spend eternity in Hell; to be eternally in union with Him is to spend eternity in Heaven. Both Heaven and Hell are real places of eternal existence. (John 3:16, 18, 36; 1 John 2:25; 5:11-13; Rev 20:5
